Edwin Johnson, instructed the court then in session that a decision had been given by the Supreme Court of the then Territory of Utah, in regard to County Warrants being registered papers, and should draw legal interest, which is 8% according to the Statutes. Now therefore be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, that under and by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 18 of the laws of West of 1897 entitled, "An act permitting Counties, Cities, Towns, School Board and school districts to fund the floating indebtedness existing at the time, West was admitted as a State, that the County of Emery borrow from the State of West, the sum of \$8,500.<sup>00</sup> upon interest at the rate of six per cent per annum for a term of twenty years from date, and that there be issued negotiable coupon bonds, of said Emery County in the aggregate sum of \$8,500.<sup>00</sup> that the said bonds be of the denomination of \$100.<sup>00</sup> each and be made payable twenty years after date or at any time before that date and after ten years after date, at the pleasure of the County, in lawful money of the United States of -

Conceded with interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum, payable semiannually at the State Bank of Utah, at Salt Lake City. Be it further resolved, that the said bonds, shall be substantially in the following form:

No. — The County of Emery, in the State of Utah, for value received promise to pay the State of Utah, or bearer, at the office of the Treasurer of said county, on the first day of June A.D. 1897 or at any time before that date and after June first 1907, at the pleasure of the County, the sum of \$500.00 lawful money of the United States of America, with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent. per annum, payable at the State Bank of Utah, semiannually on the first day of June and December in each year on presentation and surrender of the interest coupons. Recite attached.

This bond is one of a series of Seventeen Hundred consecutively from one to seventeen and is issued by the Board of County Commissioners in conformity to a resolution of said Board dated on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of May A.D. 1897 and under authority conferred upon said Board by the provisions of an act of the Legislature of the State of Utah, entitled "An act permitting counties, cities, towns, school boards and school districts to fund the floating indebtedness existing at the time Utah was admitted as State."
