Subject: New school district, created out of parts of four other, special tax levy prior to its creation, how disposed of.

Sir: -

I beg to acknowledge the following communication from you, and upon which you seek my official opinion to wit: -

The County Commissioners created a school district (last June) from the territory of four other school districts, prior to the creating of the new district two of the school districts from which territory was taken in creating the new district, had levied a special school tax for building purposes, there had also been (prior to creating of new district) one half of one percent, levied by the trustees of the four school districts

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For the purpose of defraying current expenses, etc.
Now the question that I wish to submit for your opinion is, do
have the county commissioners the power to refer to the newly created district,
the special school tax, also the one half of one per cent, which has been
collected from the New district, or shall the taxes go to the districts that voted
the levy to be made?

Your attention is called to sec. 1801 U.S. which, among other
things authorizes the county commissioners to create a district out of the part,
or parts of two or more districts, upon being petitioned so to do by so
many residents of such territory, as have the care, and custody of not less
than twenty school children, of school age, residing therein or upon the
recommendation of the county Superintendent.

This seems to be the only part of sec. 1801, which applies
to the creation of a new district out of parts of others, the balance of the
section refers to the dividing, consolidating, or changing the boundaries, etc.
of existing districts, and it authorizes the commissioners to apportion debts,
property, etc. as to them.

It will be observed that the portion of the
statute above quoted, (and it is only statute applicable) to the question
before us) only authorizes the commissioners to create a new district out of
part, or parts of existing districts.

While there is no direct authorization, conferred upon
the county commissioners to adjust the debts and property of the old district to
fit the new conditions after the change has been made, I am of the opinion
that the power to create, lodged in the commissioners carries with it the
power to adjust the debts and property rights, of the old district, and the
new one, in accordance with justice.

Without discussing the matter at greater length, you are
advised that the portion of the special taxes, for building purposes, levied upon
the property included within the boundaries of the new district created ought
to be referred to the new district, if the same has been collected, but the other
levy, of one half of one per cent, to defray current expenses, seems to
present a different principle. In this instance, I assume that the special
was created prior to the operation of the new, from the old districts and the
current expenses were for the benefit of all the territory included in the
your original districts. Therefore you are advised that the last levy
can not be referred.
