Orietta Townsite Subdivision.

Whereas, By the demise of the late William Taylor, Sr. of Ferron, Emery County, back one of its earliest pioneers; a man who served the county and public faithfully and conscientiously as one of its first county school trustees, when that position entailed many privations, hardships and self-sacrifices and for all of which he received but little financial reward. Other public services were freely given by him for the establishment and up building of Emery County and the advancement of its institutions. His advice and counsel were solicited upon many matters of public policy, and given with but one motive in mind that of the public good. We regard his death as a distinct public loss, and consider it proper and timely to express the sentiment of the present board of county commissioners, and we believe it expresses the general feeling of the people of Emery County respecting the public services of so honorable, useful and determined citizen as was William Taylor, Sr.

be referred upon the minutes of this board, and that a copy of the same be sent to the family of the deceased, and also that the same be published in the Emery County Progress.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Emery ordains as follows:

An Ordinance.

An ordinance authorizing Reuben G. Miller and associates, their lessees, heirs and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate in the County of Emery State of Utah, telegraph and telephone lines, and conferring on the said Reuben G. Miller and associates, their heirs, lessees and assigns, the right and privilege of using any and all the Public Highways and ground within said Emery County, same not to interfere with other grants.
Section I. That Reuben G. Miller and associates, their heirs, lessees and assigns be and are hereby authorized and vested with the right and privilege of constructing, maintaining and operating and using telegraph and telephone lines, poles and posts, or other appurtenances or apparatus that may be necessary for the proper transmission of messages, fire and burglar alarms and carrying on the business usually transacted by a telegraph and telephone company, to operate and construct their lines at stretch their wires, and to erect the necessary poles,

and posts and appurtenances connected therewith, throughout the limits of Emery County.

Section II.

That said Reuben G. Miller and associates, their heirs, lessees, and assigns, shall grant to the County Commissioners the full use of all their lines in Emery County for official business, and maintain one telephone instrument and tight hook in the County Court House, of said County at Castle Dale, Utah, the County Seat, to be placed at the direction of the Board of County Commissioners, said telephone instrument to be for the private use only, of the members of the Board of County Commissioners of said Emery County.

Section III.

That for said purposes they may enter at the extreme edge or sideline upon all public highways and grounds of said County, with all poles, posts, and appurtenances in the construction and erection of same, and all lines under this privilege and make such excavations, therein as may be necessary for the erection of said poles and posts, providing that such excavations shall be properly protected while open, and shall remain open no longer than necessary.

Section IV. That nothing herein shall be construed as exempting said grantor, their heirs, lessees, or assigns from any liability arising from the erection or maintenance of said lines, or from negligence of said grantor, their heirs, lessees or assigns, or their employees, or imposing any liability or responsibility upon said County, therefore.

Section V. That the rights and privileges herein granted shall continue and be in force for the term of Fifty years from the passage of this ordinance.

Section VI.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and approval and publication.

Section VII.

That said R. G. Miller and associates shall commence the construction of said telephone systems within one year from date of passage and approval of this ordinance.
