Young, signed by eleven others, asking that a road two rods wide be set apart as Public Highway following a certain course, described as follows: Beginning at the S.W. cor. of the Huntington Townsite Survey thence N. one rod; S. one mile; S. 50° W. 26 rods; S. $77\frac{1}{2}$ rods; S. $49^{\circ}50'$ E. 48 rods; S. 63° W. $26\frac{1}{2}$ rods; S. 95 rods; thence N. 158 rods; S. 81 rods; E. 2 rods; N. 79 rods; E. 253 rods; N.E. along County road 3 rods; N. 96 rods; N. 94 rods; N. 63° E. 28 rods; N. $49^{\circ}50'$ W. 50 rods; N. 75 rods; N. 30° E. 27 rods; N. one mile; N. one rd. to place of beginning.

After a careful consideration of said petition, the same was granted and on motion made a public highway.

Petition: A petition from taxpayers in Oranville and Castledale asking to have a certain portion of the County road on the bench, between Oranville & Castledale changed, was duly considered, but was laid over for further consideration.

Petition: A petition from taxpayers in Clawson asking for changing a certain portion of County road in their district was read. The commissioners went in person to investigate the feasibility of such a change, but decided to not grant the prayer.

Bond Approved: Bond for Liquor License for Leph Pace of Cross River was examined and approved and License ordered issued.

Railway Franchise: To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, Utah.

The undersigned respectfully represent that he is a resident elector of Salt Lake County, State of Utah, and a property owner within the County of Emery, State aforesaid, and as such, prays your Hon. Board that a franchise be granted to him and to his heirs, executors, administrators, assigns and successors to construct and operate for the full limit of the period allowed by law, using steam, motor or dummy engines, electric, horse or cable power, a single or double line of railway over all the public highways within the County of Emery, State aforesaid, as more particularly hereinafter set out and described in the attached proposed franchise to be granted your petitioner; also a right of way over said highways for the erection and maintenance of an electric light line and also a line for the transmission of electricity for power purposes.

Your petitioner further offers to submit to the following restrictions: 1st. A written acceptance of said franchise will be filed with the County Recorder within 30 days after the granting of the said franchise.

2nd. Work shall be commenced upon said line of railway, electric light lines and power transmission line within two years from the date of the granting of said franchise and shall be carried on uninterruptedly from such date until a line of road on all or some portion of the hereinafter mentioned highways shall have been constructed and in operation.

All of which for your consideration is respectfully submitted.

Resolution granting to Dan C. Robbins Franchise and Right of Way over certain Highways and Roads in Emery County, State of Utah.

Be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Emery County, State of Utah:

Section 1. Franchise.

That Dan C. Robbins, a citizen of the State of Utah, and doing business in the County of Emery therein, his successors and assigns, and he is hereby granted a franchise to construct, operate and maintain within the boundaries of Emery County aforesaid, under the conditions and restrictions hereinafter set forth, a general

railroad for the purpose of carrying passengers, freight, baggage, Express or United States mail; and may operate said railway by electricity, horse, cable, steam, compressed air or other motive power. Also a right of way over said highways for the erection and maintenance of an electric light line and also a line for the transmission of electricity for power purposes. This franchises are granted for a period of fifty years from the date of passage of this resolution.

Section 2. Right of way.

The rights of way herein granted shall be for a single or double track railroad, together with the requisite switches, sidetracks, turnouts, drains, culverts, viaducts, crossings, sidings, bridges, watering places, ditches, equipments and all other appurtenances necessary to a first class railroad, and poles, electric wire circuits and other necessary appliances for electric light plants and electrical transmission.

Section 3. Route.

The grants are made herein over all of the public highways and roads situated within Emery County, State aforesaid, which are particularly described as follows:

From Castledale to Huntington.

From Castledale in Sec. 34, Twp. 18 S. R. 8 E. East to the line between Secs 34 & 35, thence in a North easterly course through the NE 1/4 of Sec. 35 and Sec's 26, 23, 14, 12 & 1 in Twp. aforesaid. thence North easterly through SE 1/4 of SE 1/4 Sec 36 to Twp. line between Ranges 8 & 9 E. in Twp. 17 S. thence along said line to the town of Huntington.

From the NE corner of the townsite of Huntington in a N Easterly course to Sec. line between Sec. 18 & 19. Twp. 17 S. R. 9 E. thence Northward to the center of Sec. 18; thence in a N Easterly course through the remaining part of Sec. 18; thence continuing on in the same course through Sec's 8, 9, 4 & 3 in Twp. aforesaid, continuing on in the same course through Sec's 34, 26, 23, 13, 12 & 1 in Twp. 16 S. R. 9 E. to County boundary line.

From Huntington to the Mounds.

Beginning at the NE cor. of Huntington, thence in a N. Easterly course to the line between Sec. 18 & 19. Twp. 17 S. R. 9 E; thence N. to about the center of SE 1/2 of Sec. 18; thence in a N. Easterly course to the center. thence due E. through Sec's 17, 16, 15, 14 & 13 to the Townsite of Cleveland.

From the NE cor. of Cleveland Townsite in an Easterly course for about 1/4 mile; thence a N. Easterly course to corners of Sec's 7, 8, 17 & 18. thence due East along the Sec. line between Sec's 8 & 17, 9 & 16; thence a little

N. of East through Sec's 10+11; thence about NE through Sec. 1 in Twp. 17 S. R. 10 E. continuing on in same course through Sec's 36, 31, 30+20; thence bearing more to the East through Sec's 16, 15, 10, 11+12 in Twp. 16 S. R. 11 E. and about due East through Sec's 6+5 to the Maunds in Twp. 16 S. R. 12 E.

From Castledale to Cleveland.

Through Lawrence at a point (on the road described between Huntington and Castledale) about half way between the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner and the Sec. corner between Sec's 23+14. Twp. 18 S. R. 8 E. thence about due East along said line to corner of Sec's 13, 14, 23+24, of Twp. & R. of said. thence in a NEasterly course through Sec. 13, in Twp. & R. of said and continuing on in the same course in Sec. 18 to point about 40 rods South of the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between Sec's 18+17. Twp. 18 S. R. 9 E. thence Northward to said corner; thence on in the same course through Sec. 8, and bearing a little East of North through Sec. 5 to the townsite of Lawrence.

Leaving the townsite of Lawrence, then in an Easterly course along the township line between Twp. 17 S. & 18 S. R. 9 E. about 50 rods; thence in a NEasterly course to intersect the line between Sec's 33+34 about 60 rods N. of the corner; thence in a NEasterly course through Sec's 34, 27, 26, 23+14 intersecting the road from Huntington to Cleveland at the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between Sec's 13+14. Twp. 17 S. R. 9 E.

Road from Orangeville to intersect road from Castledale to Huntington.

Beginning at a point near the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between Sec's 28+29 Twp. 18 S. R. 8 E. thence in a NEasterly course through Sec's 28+27, 22+23 intersecting said road near the point where the road turns off for Lawrence.

From Castledale to Orangeville.

Leaving Castledale at the N.W. corner; thence in a N.Westerly course through Sec's 33+28 intersecting the road from Orangeville to Huntington near the townsite of Orangeville.

From Castledale South to Ferran & Emery.

Leaving Castledale on its S. side about the center of said townsite survey, Plat A. thence S. through Sec 4; thence in a S.Westerly course through Sec's 9, 8, 19+18. Twp. 19 S. R. 8 E. and continuing on in the same course through Sec. 24. Twp. 19 S. R. 7 E. thence bearing S. through Sec. 26, and to a point a little S.W. of the center of the Sec, thence bearing to the N. to the Sec. line and through the S.E. corner of Sec. 34. Twp. 19 S. R. 7 E. thence bearing more to S. through Sec. 3 to line between Sec's 3+10; thence due S. to the N.E. corner of the townsite of Ferran. Plat A.

Leaving Ferran to the South end of Main Street, thence South along the line between Sec's 15, 16, 21+22 to a point about 80 rods

from the cor. of Sec's 21, 22, 27 + 28; thence bearing W. to South boundary line of Sec. 21 and through Sec. 28 and to about the center of Sec. 32; thence bearing E. and intersecting Twp. line between Tps. 20 + 21 S. R. 76; thence bearing in S. westerly course through Sec's 5, 8, 17, 18 + 19 intersecting Twp. line at the SW. corner of Sec. 19 Twp. 21 S. R. 76. thence bearing a little more to the W. through Sec's 25 + 35 and SE. corner of Sec. 34. to the S. boundary of Twp. 21 S. R. 66; thence S. to center of Sec. 3 Twp. 22 S. R. 66; thence W. to NE. corner of Emery Townsite.

Road from Ferron to Malen and intersect road from Ferron to Emery.

Beginning at a point near the center of Sec. 35. Twp. 19 S. R. 76. thence in a S. easterly course to S. boundary of said Twp. thence continuing on in same direction through Sec's 21 + 12 in Twp. 4 Range aforesaid to the Townsite of Malen; thence due South along Twp. line for three miles to the corner of Sec's 25 + 36 Twp. 20 S. R. 76. + Secs 30, 31 Twp. 20 S. R. 88. thence in a S. westerly course through Sec. 36 Twp. 20 S. R. 76. thence continuing on in same direction through Sec's 1, 2, 11, 15, 21, 20, 19 + 30, intersecting W. boundary of Twp. 21 S. R. 76. at a point near the 1/4 corner of Sec's 30 + 25 thence continuing on in same course to the intersection of road from Ferron to Emery.

Section 4, Condition of Tracks.

It is hereby conditioned that said grantee shall keep in good repair the space inside its track and a space, at least ten feet on each side on the outside of the same. Good and permanent crossings shall be made by said grantee at the intersection of its tracks with streets, roads or highways, and elsewhere along said tracks as the Board of Commissioners may direct, and said track and intersections shall be kept in good repair subject to the approval of said commissioners.

The said grantee shall construct over all water courses crossed by its tracks, substantial flumes, boxes, culverts or bridges, subject to the approval of the Board of Commissioners, and such water courses shall be left free and unobstructed. The said grantee shall also comply with the directions of the Board of County Commissioners in the construction and regulation of the road to the end that such construction and regulation shall not cause any unnecessary impediment to the common and ordinary use of the highways or roads for all purposes.

Section 5, Other Use of Highways.

Nothing in this grant shall be so construed as to prevent Emery County or its authorized agents from grading, altering, repairing or

in any manner using or improving any of the roads or highways mentioned herein, but all such improvements shall be made with as little injury as practicable to said railroad and the operation thereof.

Section 6. Liability for Damage.

It is further agreed, that Emory County shall in no way be liable or responsible for any accident or damage which may occur in the construction or operation of said railroad, and the acceptance of this grant shall be deemed as an agreement on the part of said grantee his successors and assigns, to save the said County harmless and from and against all liability, loss, costs, expenses or damage of any nature arising out of any fault or misconduct of the said grantee and its successors or other employees, or which may accrue by reason of any accident or injuries which may occur in or by reason of the construction or operation of said railroad, and to indemnify and pay said County for any loss, costs, expenses or damage of any kind it may sustain by reason of any fault or misconduct, accident or injury; and if any judgment for any damage for any such fault, misconduct, accident or injury shall be recovered against the said County, the recovery and judgment thereof shall be final as between the said County and the said grantee and his successors and assigns, and conclusive as to the liability of the latter to the former; provided that said grantee has not notice of the pendency of the suit in which said judgment is recovered, and has had a reasonable opportunity to participate in defending the same.

Section 7. Limitation.

This grant of Right-of-Way herein is made for the period of fifty years from the date of the passage of this Resolution and is accepted on the following conditions, namely: That if the grantee, his successors and assigns, shall fail to perform all the stipulations of this resolution, The Board of County Commissioners upon sixty days' notice, and upon failure on the part of said Rabbins, his assignor or successors to provide a remedy or to make satisfactory arrangements to remove the cause of complaint, may declare the privilege herein granted forfeited, and proceed to take full possession and control of the roadbed over the routes named herein.

Section 8. Forfeiture.

If this grant with the terms and conditions herein provided be not accepted by said grantee within thirty days after the passage of this resolution, or if work be not commenced within two years after said passage, or the work is not continued until the construction and operation of the line over all or a portion of the route named;

herein, then this grant as to all portions of the highways and roads named herein shall be forfeited by the said grantee.

Section 9. Non-Forfeiture.

It is expressly understood that if the grantee herein, his successors and assigns, shall fail to perform or comply with any of the terms or conditions of this resolution by reason of a strike of his employees or of any act of God or unavoidable casualty or inevitable accident, then such failure shall not operate as a forfeiture of the grantee's rights or privileges under this resolution.

Adopted September 5th, 1906. on motion of Commissioner Anton Nielsen, all members of the Board voting "Aye".

On motion the Franchise hereinafter recorded, was granted to C. L. Allen and Co. same to be published at the expense of Grantee, C. L. Allen & Co. All members voting aye.

Ordinance No. 17

An ordinance granting to C. L. Allen and Co. Successors and assigns, the right to construct, operate and maintain an Electric light, heat and power system, or either or any of them, for light heat and other purposes in the County of Emery, State of Utah, to supply said County with light heat and power and to collect compensation therefor.

Be it enacted by the Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, State of Utah as follows.

Section 1.

That the right and privileges be and is hereby granted to C. L. Allen and Co. their successors and assigns to construct operate and maintain, an electric light, heat, gas and power system or either or any of them, to erect poles any height desired and to string wires thereon (24) twenty feet or more above the surface of the ground, along all public Highways, in the said County of Emery, State of Utah, to construct place and operate at suitable places, all necessary buildings, appurtenances and appliances, thereto necessary and of use, in and about the business of carrying on, and maintaining, an electric light, heat gas and power system, or either or any of them, both for public and private use in the County of Emery, State of Utah.

Section 2

It is hereby further granted to the said C. L.

Allen and Co., Successors and assigns, the right to furnish to the County of Emery, State of Utah, and to contract therefor electricity, and gas for light heat and power purposes, and the right to demand and collect, from those who may use, electricity, or gas for light heat and power purposes from said system compensation therefor at such reasonable prices as may be agreed upon, between the said C. L. Allen and Co., Successors and assigns, and the users of said light heat and power.

Section 3

The said C. L. Allen and Co. Successors and assigns, shall within 90 months after the passage and approval according to law, of this ordinance, commence the construction of an electric light, heat and gas system, or either or any of them within a period of (2) two years from the date of the passage of this ordinance, as provided herein.

Section 4

The rights and privileges herein granted shall be for a period of fifty (50) years.

Section 5

Light, heat, gas and power, or either or any of them shall be furnished by said C. L. Allen and Co. Successors and assigns as the contracting parties may stipulate.

Section 6

Before this franchise can be enforced and have any effect the said C. L. Allen and Co. shall file with the clerk of said County an acceptance of the terms and conditions of this franchise.

Section 7

The said C. L. Allen and Co. Successors and assigns, hereby agree to hold the County of Emery State of Utah, harmless from any damage arising to any person or property during the construction, maintenance, or operation of said electric light, heat gas and power system or either or any of them when such damage occurs through the negligence of the company.

And that the grantees, their successors and assigns will perform the obligations by them to be kept, and performed as in this Ordinance stated.

Section 8

All ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent with this franchise are hereby repealed.

Section 9

This Ordinance shall take effect, and be in force from and after due publication.
