We pledge ourselves to keep the road to Mounds in good condition, and improve the same as rapidly as the County's finances will permit, if this action is taken.

Be it ordained by the Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, Utah; That Whereas a petition signed by Walter L.Barney and 53 other free holders of Clawson precinct having been this day presented to the County Commissioners and read asking that Emery County abandon a certain piece of County road through Rock Canyon Flat described as follows; Beg. at a point 32 rds South and 19 rds West of the NW corner of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 19, Tp. 19 S. R. 8 E. S.L.M. thence running South Westerly through said quarter mentioned above; thence continuing South Westerly diagonally through the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 24, Tp. 19 S. R. 7 E. S.L.M. thence diagonally in a South Westerly direction across the SE Corner of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the last named Section, township and range, continuing in a SouthWesterly direction across the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 24, Tp. 19 S. of Range 7 East, S.L.M. and ending at a point on the South side of the Rock Canyon Wash 24 rds South and 24 rods East of the SW corner of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 24, Township 19 S. of Range 7 East of Salt Lake Meridian and to establish inlieu thereof as a County road the following described route; beginning at a point 32 rds

Smith Clerk Carbon county stating that a petition had had been filed with the County Commissioners of Carbon county asking them to build a wagon road from Woodside in Emery County to Sunnyside, and asking the County Commissioners of this county if they would appropriate for same was read, and as no petition had been filed in this office the Clerk was instructed to notify the County Commissioners of Carbon county that no action would be taken at this time.

A communication from Carbon county asking for a portion of transitory tax on tax paid by Chrystal Brothers and Starr brothers in this county, was laid over for one month.

CANCELLING OF APPROPRIATION.

On motion the appropriation of \$8.25 per month for rent of hospital to Dr. C.J. Ferguson previously ordered by the Board was cancelled.

PETITION FOR CHANGE OF COUNTY ROAD.

A petition signed by William Hitchcock and 15 other citizens of Clawson precinct asking that Emery County abandon all that county road described as follows; commencing at the SE corner of lot 1 in block 3, Clawson Townsite survey, Emery County, Utah, thence West to the West line of Hardy farm; thence South West to the intersection of County road now asked in said petition to be established and laid out as a county road, and to lay out and establish as a county road in lieu thereof the following described route; commencing five rods South Thiede's store (SE corner Lot. 1 Blk. 3, Clawson Townsite) and running South 48 rods; thence South West about 120 rods; and intersecting county road at a point near upper North canal. The Board of County Commissioners met as per adjournment and there being no further equalization business to transact at this time the following County business was then taken up and disposed of as follows;

A communication from E.F. The Clerk was instructed to write the said E.F. Marshall stating that a new floor would be furnished for the bridge at the proper time.

A petition signed by Walter Beaston and 13 other citizens of Green River precinct asking that a separate School District be created from Northern part of the present Green River School District was read and considered and on motion the same was not granted as the Commissioners did not deem it advisable to divide the said district at this time as the valuation of property in the territory asked to be segregated would not furnish sufficient revenue to properly conduct the affairs of a separate school district.

PETITION.

A petition signed by Jasper Mc Grillis and forty seven other citizens of Green River asking that the County lay out and maintain a 40 foot highway described as follows; Beginning at a point on the West bank of Green River, Emery County, Utah 100 feet South East of where the line of Lot 3 in Section 22 Tp. 21 S. R. 16 East of the Salt Lake Meridian intersects Green River which point is East of the West $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 21 560 feet thence North West 400 feet; thence West 200 feet; thence North 600 feet; thence North West 1470 feet; thence West 466 feet to a point which is South of the North West corner of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 21 660 feet; thence North on said West line to the SW cor. of the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16 thence North to the NW cor. of said East $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 16 and there to intersect a street in what is known as Orchard Home Town of Green River, Utah and called Elberta Avenue, was read and upon motion the said petition was ordered granted on condition that the interested parties place the said described road in condition for travel when the same would be formally accepted at a later date.

A petition signed by Doren Perrine and 21 other citizens of Green River asking that the County lay out and maintain a public highway in said precinct described as follows; Beginning at the SW cor of Lot 9 Section 4 Tp 21 S. R. 16 E. S.L.M. and running thence E on the line parallel with the Township line to the West bank of Green River was read and as the Board being informed that the entire right of way was not granted, upon motion the said petition was not granted.

VERBAL STATEMENT.

D.C.Woodward, County Superintendent of Schools appeared before the Board and made a verbal report on his trip of inspection of the public schools of Salt Lake and Utah counties, stating that in his opinion the studies of art and music were taught more thoroughly in the said counties than in the County of Emery, and the attendance was more regular. He recommended that the County School levy be placed at a higher rate, also that a redistricting of the several districts in Emery County was necessary in order to secure the best results in School work.

He also asked permission to visit the National Educational Association which convenes in Denver July 5th to 9th, 1909 and that his expenses be paid by the County of Emery, and it being the sentiment of the Commissioners that the said trip would be beneficial to the Schools of Emery County the request was granted.

SALE OF PROPERTY FOR TAXES CONFIRMED.

The sale of Lots 3 and 4 in Block 33, Huntington Townsite, for taxes upon which the time for redemption had expired, which sale was advertised to take place on the 31st day of May, 1909 but on account of the said date being a legal holiday the said sale was postponed until June 1st, 1909 was confirmed. The taxes, Interests and costs of the said lot 3, Blk 33 being \$33.02 and to this amount was ordered placed \$6.90 as the cost of publishing notice of sale, Total \$39.92, being the minimum amount for which the said lot can be sold at private sale, and to the amount of \$9.80, being the taxes, interest and costs of Lot 4 in block 33, the amount of \$6.90 as cost of publishing notice of sale was ordered added, total \$16.70 being the minimum amount for which the said lot ~~4~~ in block 33 can be sold at private sale as aforesaid.

The Board being informed that G.T.Olsen had sold his mercantile business at Emery and the same being personal property and no provision being made for the payment of the taxes of 1909, the County Assessor was on motion ordered to collect the said taxes in compliance with the provisions of Section 2656, Compiled Laws of Utah, or secure same.

The Boards of County Commissioners of Grand and Emery Counties met at Green River, Utah on above date as per previous appointment. It was further moved by Commissioner Branson of Grand County and seconded by Commissioner Meeks of Emery, that A.D.Wilson of Elgin, Utah, be employed to make further and more definite sounding, surveys, etc. of Green River, at the site for said bridge, also that the said A.D.Wilson and two members of the Green River Commercial Club be appointed as a committee to definitely locate the saite for said bridge and that as soon as the said work is finished that the information be sent to M.E.Idle, Salt Lake City, Utah. The said motion carried unanimously.

A motion by Commissioner Branson of Grand County, seconded by Commissioner Meeks of Emery authorizing Mark Tuttle, Secretary of the Joint Board of County Commissioners, to prepare and publish a notice calling for bids for the construction of said bridge as soon as the said plans and specifications are approved by the State Engineer, the said notice to be published in the Green River Dispatch, Green River, Utah, Grand Valley Times, Moab, Utah, and Engineering News, New York, N.Y. carried unanimously.

Samuel Singleton, Chairman of the Board was appointed a committee of one to represent the Commissioners and the people at Salt Lake City, Utah, August 4th, 1909, the date set for hearing complaints against the proposed raise.

VERBAL STATEMENT.



AN ORDINANCE.

Providing for the issue and negotiation of Thirty Five Thousand (\$35,000.00) Dollars in Bonds of the County of Emery, State of Utah.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF EMERY COUNTY, UTAH.

THAT WHEREAS, On the first day of December, A.D. 1909, the Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, State of Utah, at a meeting legally called and held, at which meeting all the members of the Board were present, and all the members of the Board concurring therein, it was duly ordered, determined and decided that the public good required that the bridges over the streams in Emery County which were washed away and damaged by the heavy floods occurring during the Summer of 1909 be replaced, and that improvements be made on the main County road of Emery County between the Boundary line South of Emery, Utah, and the boundary line North of Huntington, Utah, and that the sum of money necessary for the construction of the said bridges and improvements of County roads was as follows, to-wit-; For the building of a steel bridge with concrete abutments over the Muddy river at Emery, Utah the sum of \$4,000.00; For above described bridge over Ferron river at Ferron, Utah the sum of \$5,500.00; For above described bridge over Cottonwood river at Orangeville, Utah the sum of \$6,800.00; For above described bridge over Cottonwood river at Castle Dale, Utah the sum of \$6,800.00; and for the building of above described bridge over Huntington river at Huntington, Utah the sum of \$5,500.00; ~~and~~ for the payment of Emery County's portion of the deficiency in appropriation made by the State of Utah for the building of a bridge over Green River at Green River, Emery County, Utah the sum of \$3,997.50 and for the improvements on main County road in Emery County, Utah the sum of \$2,802.50; and

Whereas there were not sufficient funds in the treasury of Emery County to defray the said expense or any part thereof and it then became and now is necessary to incur an indebtedness of said County for the purpose aforesaid in the sum of Thirty Five Thousand (\$35,000.00) Dollars; and

Whereas, it was then and there further ordained by the said Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, Utah, under and in accordance with, and pursuant to the provisions of and under the authority conferred by Section 518 of the Compiled Laws of Utah, 1907, that a special election be held in the said County of Emery, State of Utah on Saturday the 8th day of January, 1910 for the purpose of submitting to the electors of said County duly qualified to vote at such election, to-wit: such voters as shall have paid a property tax in Emery County in the year 1909, the following question to-wit-; " Shall the County of Emery, State of Utah incur an indebtedness ^{by the issue of its bonds} in the sum of Thirty five thousand dollars for the purpose of raising funds wherewith to construct steel bridges with concrete abutments on the main County road in Emery County, Utah over the following rivers, viz; Muddy river at Emery, Utah, the sum of \$4,000.00; Ferron river at Ferron, Utah the sum of \$5,500.00; Cottonwood river at Orangeville, Utah the sum of \$6,800.00; over Cottonwood river at Castle Dale, Utah the sum of \$6,800.00; over Huntington river at Huntington, Utah the sum of \$5,500.00; For the payment of Emery County's portion of deficiency in appropriation made by the State of Utah for the building of a bridge over Green River at Green River, Utah the sum of \$3,997.50 and for the improvements on main County road of Emery County between the boundary line South of Emery and the boundary line North of Huntington the sum of \$2,802.50, said bonds to be payable twenty years after date thereof or at any time before the expiration of the said twenty years and after ten years from the date thereof at the pleasure of said County, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of 5% per annum, from the date thereof until paid, interest to be payable semi annually; and

Whereas on said date, December 1st, 1909, the said Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, Utah at said meeting did order that a notice of the said special elect-

tion be given by publication in the Emery County Progress and Green River Dispatch, both being newspapers published in Emery County, Utah, as required by Section 518 of the Compiled Laws of Utah, 1907, which said notice was pursuant to and in accordance with the said order of the said Board, and of the law duly published in five consecutive issues of each of said papers before the said 8th day of January, 1910, both of said papers being published weekly and having a general circulation in said Emery County, the date of the first publication in the said Emery County Progress being December 4th, 1909 and the date of the last publication being January 1st, 1910 and the date of the first publication in the Green River Dispatch being December 9th, 1909 and the date of the last publication being January 8th, 1910; and;

Whereas notice was duly given of the date and place of holding the said election and the hours during which the polls would remain open by posting in all respects as required by law, notices thereof in at least five conspicuous places within each and every election district within and of the said Emery County, which said notices and each of them were and remained posted for a period of at least five days continuously prior to the said 8th day of January, 1910 as required by law; and,

Whereas, pursuant to the law and the said notices and the said order of the Board of County Commissioners the said election was duly held in the manner prescribed by law on the 8th day of January, 1910, and,

Whereas on Tuesday the 11th day of January, 1910, at 12 o' clock noon of said day, at an adjourned meeting of said board, held at the usual place of meeting of said Board, whereat it was found that the returns from Green River and Woodside precincts were at this hour not received by the County Clerk and on motion an adjournment was taken until 3 p.m. of said day. At this hour the Commissioners met as per adjournment and then and there found the returns from all the voting districts in said county were before the Board; and whereas Commissioner C.A. Larson being absent on motion duly carried Nephi L. Williams, County Treasurer of Emery County was appointed to act as one of the Board of Canvassers, in accordance with Section 370, C.L. of Utah, 1907, to canvass the returns of the said election, the result of said canvass of votes cast at the said special election, being that the number of votes cast at said election by the voters of said County, duly qualified as aforesaid, and upon the question hereinbefore set forth was 653, of which said votes 528 the said board found to have been cast in favor of the creation of such indebtedness and the issue of said bonds, and that a majority of the voters duly qualified as aforesaid, voting at such election had voted in favor of the creation of such indebtedness, and the issue of said bonds and not otherwise, which said result of the said canvass the said Board did then and there immediately declare and the same was duly and regularly entered on the records of said Board by the Clerk thereof; and

Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, Utah met on above date in regular session all members present. The following business being then transacted.

MINUTES.

The minutes of special sessions of January 11th and 28th were read, approved and signed.

PETITION.

A petition signed by Ole W. Tuft and seventy other citizens of Castle Dale, and Lawrence precincts asking that a certain change be made in the County road from Lawrence to Castle Dale as outlined therein, also a protest signed by John V. Jensen against the proposed change were read and duly considered and upon motion laid over for one month for further investigation.

APPOINTMENTS.

On motion George H. Kofford was appointed Constable for Castle Dale, precinct, Niels Rosengerantz was appointed Constable for Ferron precinct and Isaac Allred was appointed Constable for Emery precinct.

ERRONEOUS TAX.

A communication from Fruit Growers State Bank, Green River, Utah in relation to an unjust assessment on their property for the year 1909 was read and duly considered and it appearing to the Board that the said assessment was unjust and erroneous to the amount of \$4,000.00 on motion the County Clerk of Emery County was ordered to issue a warrant to the said Fruit Grower's State Bank in the sum of \$162.00, being the tax on the said amount computed at 40½ mills.

PETITION LAID OVER.

The petition of citizens of Cleveland precinct asking that a new school district be created to be named Carson was again laid over for one month.

COMMUNICATIONS LAID OVER.

The communications of Robert Woodruff and W. H. Pace previously considered by the Board were again laid over.

JUSTICES'S REPORT.

The report of P. E. Johnsen, Justice of the Peace of Huntington was accepted.

COMMUNICATION.

A communication from J. McGrillis asking that a certain road in Green River precinct be designated as a County road was taken up and considered, and on motion the County Clerk was instructed to notify the said J. McGrillis that the petition would be granted when the highway and rail road crossing was placed in first class condition.

APPROVAL OF CONTRACTORS BOND.

The bond of Jas. J. Burke and Co., Salt Lake City, Utah, in the sum of \$14,300.00, given as a guarantee that the construction of the bridges awarded to him January 28th, would be properly performed in accordance with contract was approved and County Clerk authorized to refund the certified check in the sum of \$3,500.00, filed by the said Jas. J. Burke with his bid.

DEMANDS FOR PORTION OF TAX.

The demands of Utah, Wasatch and Grand Counties for a portion of the tax collected by Emery County on transitory herds was read and considered and on motion the County Clerk and County Treasurer of Emery County was authorized to compute the amount due and after deducting the necessary expenses of assessing and collecting of same to issue warrant for amount due the respective counties.

FROM POOR FUND.

The following named persons were granted amounts from poor fund as follows; Mrs. George Collier, Emery, \$10.00; Mrs. Isaac Behunin, Ferron \$10.00; Mrs. Maria Foote, Emery \$20.00.

RESOLUTION.

It is hereby ordered and resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, State of Utah, that whereas at a special election duly held in the said county on Saturday the 8th day of January, 1910, there was submitted to such qualified electors of Emery County, State of Utah as should have paid a property tax in the year preceeding such election the following proposition, to-wit; Shall the County of Emery, State of Utah create an indebtedness and issue its bonds therefor in the sum of Thirty Five Thousand, (\$35,000.00) Dollars for the purpose of constructing steel bridges with concrete abutments over the following rivers in Emery County, to-wit: Over Muddy river, at Emery, Utah the sum of \$4,000.00; over Ferron river at Ferron, Utah the sum of \$5300.00; over Cottonwood river at Orangeville, Utah the sum of \$6,800.00; over Cottonwood river at Castle Dale, Utah the sum of \$6,800.00 and over Huntington river at Huntington, Utah, the sum of \$5,300.00; for the purpose of paying Emery counties portion of the deficiency in appropriation made by the State of Utah for the building of a bridge over Green River at Green River, Utah the sum of \$3,997.50 and for improvements on main county highway between the county line South of Emery, Utah and the county line North of Huntington, Utah the sum of \$2,802.50, and,

Whereas, a majority of the said voters voting at said election in favor of creating such indebtedness and issuing said bonds, which result was duly ascertained, and declared by said Board acting as a board of canvassers on Tuesday the 11th day of January, 1910.

Now therefore be it resolved that the County Treasurer of said Emery County, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the purchase of the said bonds. Said notice to bidders shall be published for a period of three successive weeks in the Emery County Progress, a weekly newspaper published in Castle Dale, Emery County, Utah and having a general circulation therein. Said notice shall describe the said bonds and their conditions as set forth in an ordinance prescribing the form of said bonds, which said ordinance was passed by the Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, Utah on the 11th day of January, A.D. 1910.

Said notice shall further require that all bids for said bonds shall be accompanied by a certified check in the sum of five per cent of the face value of the bonds bid for, payable to the order of the Treasurer of Emery County as a guaranty of good faith on the part of the bidder, and to reimburse the said county for its loss and expence incurred in this behalf in case the bidder shall not perform his bid after, and in case it is accepted by said County.

That no bid for a sum less than the face value of the bonds bid for will be considered, and that the said county reserves the right to reject any and all bids offered; and that all bids shall be sealed and placed in the hands of the County Treasurer of said Emery County on or before 10 o' clock A.M. February 28th, 1910.

Within thirty days after the acceptance of any bid offered the bidder shall tender to the Treasurer of said County at his office at Castle Dale, Emery County, Utah the amount of the bid in cash(lawful money of the United States) and in case of failure so to do the acceptance of said bid by said County shall become null and void and its option and the deposit accompanying such bid shall be forfeited to said County.

Board of County Commissioners of Emery County met on above date, all members present. The following business being then transacted.

MINUTES.

The minutes of Special session of February 28th, 1910 were read, approved and signed.

PETITION FOR IRRIGATION DISTRICT.

The petition for the organization of an irrigation district within the County of Emery, State of Utah to be known as THE GREEN RIVER IRRIGATION DISTRICT was presented to the Board of County Commissioners by John H. Briscoe, E.H. Lyon and E.D. Roberts they being the committee selected by the petition for that purpose said petition was accompanied by the bond of E.H. Lyon, E.D. Roberts and Doren Ferrine for the sum of \$1,500.00 conditioned for the payment of all costs incurred in said proceedings in case said organization shall not be affected, said petition was also accompanied by a proof of publication of said petition and of a notice by signed by the said committee John H. Briscoe, E. H. Lyon and E.D. Roberts of the time and place when said petition would be presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, Utah.

The Board then proceeded to the examination of the bond accompanying said petition and being fully advised found said bond to be good and sufficient and in double the amount of the probable cost of organizing such district thereupon it was moved by Commissioners J.B. Meeks and seconded by Commissioner C.A. Larson that the said bond be approved by the Board of County Commissioners. Upon motion being put Commissioners Larson, Meeks and Singleton voted aye and the motion was declared carried and the bond approved.

It was moved and seconded that the Board take up the matter of the said petition and proceed to a hearing thereon which motion being put Commissioners Larson, Meeks and Singleton voted aye thereon and the motion was declared duly carried.

Thereupon the said E.H.Lyon and E.D.Roberts were duly sworn and gave in their testimony in support of the allegations of said petition and also submitted to said Board a plat of said proposed district showing the boundaries thereof and the routes of the canals of said proposed district and the Board being duly advised in the premises doth find that the signers of said petition and all of them are land owners within said proposed district; that the signers of said petition constitute a majority of the land owners within said proposed irrigation district and that the signers of said petition are also the owners in the aggregate of the majority of the whole number of acreage belonging to the land owners within said proposed district; that the said proposed district and the lands embraced therein lies wholly in the County of Emery and the State of Utah and that the said petition is in all respects regular and proper and in accordance with the terms and provisions of the act of the Legislature of the State of Utah, entitled:

" An act in relation to the creation of irrigation districts, providing the method of fixing and altering thereof; defining the manner of organizing and dissolving Irrigation Districts; Providing for District Elections and defining the manner of proclaiming and giving notice for the same and prescribing the method of their regulations; Determining the method of balloting and fixing the qualifications of electors; Providing for a Board of Directors in each district and defining the powers and duties thereof, also defining the duties of County Officers in connection with Irrigation Districts; Providing for the exercise of the right of eminent domain in certain cases; Providing for the bonding of Districts and prescribing the method of issuing and discharging the bonds; Providing for the levy and assessment of taxes; Prescribing the method of advertising for bids; Defining the manner of submitting claims against the District and providing for the manner of withdrawing from a district and hearings in certain cases. "

Approved March 22d, 1909.

The Board doth further find that that the petitioners have heretofore presented their bonds as required by the aforesaid act in the sum of Fifteen Hundred (\$1500.00) Dollars which bond has heretofore on this Seventh day of March, 1910 been approved and accepted; that the notice signed by the Committee of said petitioners selected by the petition for that purpose giving the time and place of the presentation of the same to said board of County Commissioners and also a copy of said petition as required by the act above referred to have been published in the Green River Dispatch, a newspaper of general circulation of the County of Emery, State of Utah and printed and published at Green River, in the County of Emery and State of Utah; that the said notice and copy of said petition were published for at least two weeks before the time at which the same was to be presented to this Board; that said publication with proof thereof has been duly made and filed with the Board; that all persons interested have had due and proper and legal notice of the proceedings therein, to be had and that all and every thing has been done in the premises according to law to give the Board jurisdiction to hear said petition and that the Board of County Commissioners has jurisdiction to hear said petition and fix, define and establish the boundaries of said proposed district and to make such orders as are required by the act above referred to and to declare the same organized pursuant to law.

Thereupon the Board proceeded to examine, fix, define and establish the boundaries of said proposed district from said petition and from such applications for the exclusions of lands therefrom and the inclusion of lands therein as were made in accordance with the statutes and the Board having carefully examined the boundaries of said proposed district as set forth in said petition and the application of W.M.Hunsberger, et.al. to include other lands in said proposed district than those included within the boundaries of the proposed district as set forth in the petition for the organization of the District. It was moved by Commissioner J.B.Meeks and seconded by Commissioner C.A.Larson that the lands described in the petition of W.M.Hunsberger, et. al be not included in said proposed district. Upon the motion being put the vote resulted as follows; Commissioners Singleton, Larson and Meeks voted aye and the motion was declared carried.

PETITION FOR IRRIGATION DISTRICT.

It was then moved by Commissioner C.A. Larson and seconded by Commissioner J.B. Weeks that the following final order be duly entered defining and establishing the boundaries of said proposed irrigation district.

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of County Commissioners that the Boundaries of said proposed district be fixed, defined and established as follows, to wit;

And be it further ordered that notice of said election signed by the Chairman and the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners be issued given and published which said notice shall embody in substance the orders of the County Commissioners concerning the organization of said District and shall give public notice of said election the time and place thereof, the matter submitted to the vote of the land owners and that said notice and order shall be published once a week for at least three weeks prior to such election in the Green River Dispatch, a newspaper of general circulation in said Emery County, Utah and said notice shall state that all persons shall be entitled to vote who are land owners of agricultural lands within said District, but that land owners not residing within the district shall be entitled to vote only within the division of such district wherein their lands or a major portion thereof are located and any person entitled to vote as aforesaid shall also be eligible to election as a director in and for the division in such district in which the major proportion of his lands are located; that the ballots to be used and cast at such election for the formation of such district shall be substantially, as follows; " Irrigation District Yes " or "Irrigation District No." Or words equivalent thereto and shall also contain the names of the persons to be voted for as members of the Board of Directors of said District, as follows; As a member of the Board of Directors from Division Number one the name of E.H.Lyon; As a member of the Board of Directors from Division Number 2 the name of John H.Briscoe; And as a member of the Board of Directors from Division Number three the name of E.D.Roberts. Each land Owner may vote for three directors, one from each division and shall indicate his vote by a placing a marginal cross upon the ballot for or against any question submitted or name voted upon and opposite thereto at said election; that each elector as provided therein shall be entitled to cast one vote for each acre of land or fraction thereof owned by such elector and shall sign the ballot and indicate opposite his or her name the number of acres owned by the electors casting the ballot.

The motion being duly and lawfully put Commissioners C.A.Larson, Meeks and Singleton voted aye and the majority of the Board having voted aye the motion was declared duly carried and the order adopted.

APPLICATION FOR PURCHASE OF TRANSIT.

The verbal application of Elias H. Cox for the purchase of Surveyors transit owned by County was taken under advisement.

APPORTIONMENT OF SCHOOL FUND.

On proper motion the sum of \$1200.00 was ordered set aside for the payment of County Superintendent's salary and expense for the year 1910. Said amount to be taken from School fund.

PERMISSION TO USE TIMBER FOR BRIDGE.

A. H. Wall and Jesse S. Hoffitt appeared before the Board as a committee from Castle Dale Commercial Club and requested that the citizens of Castle Dale be allowed to use certain timber formerly in Castle Dale bridge for the purpose of placing the same on Huntington river on Buck Horn road. On motion permission was granted to use the long span for said purpose.

RELIEF.

The County Auditor and County Treasurer presented a statement of the amount of relief the County Treasurer was entitled to on account of taxes not collected for the year 1909, and on motion the said Treasurer was granted the following relief on the taxes for said year.
