

COMMUNICATIONS.

A communication from H.L.Snow and H.E.Larsen relative to a certain purchase of land for County road purposes on road from Huntington to Cleveland was read and considered and on motion laid over for one month.

A communication from Sagrate County demanding the tax paid in Emery County for the year 1909 by Thompson Brothers and George Jenson was read and considered and on motion the County Auditor was authorized to issue a warrant for the amount of District School tax paid by the said parties for the year 1909, in favor of Sagrate County.

ORDER TO PUT UP FENCE.

On motion the County Sheriff x was ordered to have put up on North side of Court House lot a woven wire fence with barb wire on top.

PETITION FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT.

The petition of Adolph Axelson and other citizens of Cleveland requesting that a new School District to be named Carson be created, which said petition being heretofore laid over by the Board was again taken up and considered and on motion the said petition was denied for the reason that the Commissioners did not deem it wisdom to create the said district at this time as the assessed valuation of property of the said district would not justify the said action.

PETITION FOR CHANGE OF ROAD.

The petition of certain citizens of Castle Dale and Lawrence precincts asking for a change in the County road running from Lawrence to Castle Dale, was on motion laid over for one month.

VERBAL PETITION.

A.W.Magnusson of Castle Dale appeared before the Board and requested that he be granted an appropriation to defray a part of the expense incurred by him in an accident in Price river, on the Mounds, Sunnyside road. The Commissioners not deeming the same a legal charge against the County the same was not granted.

SALE OF LAND.

The application of A.A.Van Buren to purchase 75 acres of land owned by Emery County and described as follows, to-wit; All of the North half of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 8, Tp. 19 S. R. 8 E. S. 14 N. except the North $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section, for the sum of \$75.00 was on motion granted and he having paid the said amount into the County Treasury the County Auditor was on motion ordered to issue Auditor's tax deed therefor.

ORDER TO SURVEYOR.

On motion the County Surveyor was ordered to pay the sum of \$20.00 per month for the Surveyor's transit now being used by him, when the same is used for private business, the said payments to be made monthly, and to be liable for all damage done to the said instrument. County Clerk was instructed to notify County Surveyor of said order.

OFFICIAL BONDS APPROVED.

The official bonds of A.E.Mohr Deputy Tree Inspector, Green River and Wielz Rosenkrantz, Constable of Ferron precinct were approved.

RESIGNATION AND APPOINTMENT.

The resignation of Hall E.Larsen as Deputy Road Commissioner of Cleveland precinct was accepted and E.R.Gviatt, Jr. appointed to fill vacancy.

SALE OF TRANSIT.

On motion the old transit owned by Emery County was sold to Ira R.Browning for the sum of \$40.00.

JUSTICE'S REPORT APPROVED.

The report of O.Sorenson, Jr. Justice of the Peace Castle Dale was approved.

PLAN APPROVED.

The plan of Robert Forrester, Consulting Engineer, for a concrete abutment on bridge at Emery was approved, and the proposal of Jas J. Burke to construct the same for and additional amount of \$250.00 accepted.

The claim of James Jeffs, amount \$25.00 for expense at Logan to Horticultural school was on motion not allowed.


The claim of J.H. Schunin, Tree Inspector was laid over for one month to be more fully itemized,

MAY SESSION

May 2d, 1910.

Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, Utah met on the above date in regular session. All members present. The following business was then transacted.

MINUTES.

Minutes of April session read, approved and signed.

ALLOWING OF ESTIMATE

Jas. J. Burke and Co. presented a claim against County for \$13,431.15, on account of 1st estimate on bridge contract. On motion the County Clerk was ordered to issue a warrant on the Road and Bridge bond fund in the sum of \$5,000.00, and to issue another warrant in the sum of \$8,431.15 as soon as money is received from the sale of \$35,000.00 bond issue.

APPROPRIATION.

On proper motion the sum of \$75.00 was ordered appropriated to Orangeville Town to assist in the repair of the bridge over Cottonwood Creek through Orangeville town.

PETITION AGAIN LAID OVER.

The petition of Cle H. Tuft and other citizens of Lawrence and Castle Dale precincts for a certain change of road to Lawrence was again laid over for one month.

ORDER TO PAY WARRANTS.

On motion the county warrants to be issued in payment of the claim of W.S. Peacock \$629.00, and A.C. Van Buren, \$709.85, were ordered issued on County bond fund.

APPOINTMENTS.

On motion Frank Beach was released as Deputy Road Commissioner of Holen Road District and Chris Petersen was appointed to the position.

On motion S.D. Bunnell was released as Deputy Road Commissioner for Castle Dale road district and Heber Frandsen was appointed to the position.

J.W. Leonard was on motion appointed Road Supervisor of Huntington Road District.

CHANGE OF ROAD.

H.M. Reid, et. al of Orangeville appeared before the Board as a committee and requested that the County Commissioners lay out and construct a road as follows; commencing at a point on the Castle Dale- Orangeville road about one half mile North and West of Castle Dale running thence South and East to a point in the street North and East adjoining the residence of Lars Christensen in Castle Dale, the said route to take the place of the present road which was washed away by Cottonwood Creek. The said committee stating that the right of way for said road could be purchased for the sum of Fifty dollars. On proper motion the said change was ordered granted and a warrant ordered issued to the said Lars Christensen upon the execution of a deed conveying the said right of way to Emery County.

INSTRUCTION TO ROAD COMMISSIONER.

Warren S. Peacock was instructed to proceed at once to collect all delinquent poll tax in Emery County.

PETITION LAID OVER.

The petition of Scott H. Miller and others asking that the County construct a steel bridge over the Price river at Woodside, also to assist in the construction of a wagon road from Woodside to Sunnyside was laid over for one month.

REPORT, COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT.

D.C. Woodward, County Superintendent of Schools appeared before the Board and the question of consolidating the respective school districts of Emery County into one School District of the first class was discussed. On motion it was ordered that a meeting of the School trustees and others interested be called to meet at the Court house at Castle Dale, on the 21st day of May, 1910 at 11 o' clock A.M. to further consider the said question.

ERRONEOUS TAX SALE.

An affidavit was presented, signed by E.D. Roberts relative to a tax sale made on lots 17 and 18, block B, First Division of Green River for the year 1908, stating that a house was assessed with the said lots for said year which was erroneous as there had never been a house on said property. On proper motion a redemption was ordered allowed made on said property by paying the amount of taxes accrued on real estate without the said improvements.

ORDER ESTABLISHING IRRIGATION DISTRICT.

Commissioner J.E. Meeks presented the following resolution:

WHEREAS on the 19th day of April, A.D. 1910 an election was held in the Green River Irrigation District in accordance with order of the Board of County Commissioners entered on the 9th day of March, 1910 for the purpose of determining whether the territory embraced within the boundaries of said proposed district should be organized into an irrigation district under and by virtue of an act of the Legislature of the State of Utah entitled "An act in relation to the creation of Irrigating Districts" etc. approved March 22d, 1909, and

WHEREAS proof of the publishing of the notice of the said election has been filed with the County Clerk showing that notice of said election was published in the "Green River Dispatch" a newspaper of general circulation in Emery County, once a week for at least three weeks prior to such election, and

ORDER ESTABLISHING IRRIGATION DISTRICT CONT'D.

WHEREAS the Clerks of the Boards of election in each precinct of said district have delivered returns duly certified to the County Commissioners; and,

WHEREAS, to day is the second Monday after the holding of said election;

NOW WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we the Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, State of Utah proceed to canvass the votes cast at said election;

It was moved by Commissioner C.A.Larson and seconded by Commissioner J.B.Meeks that said resolution be adopted. On motion being put Com. Meeks and Singleton and Larson voted yea and the motion was declared carried and the resolution adopted.

The Board of County Commissioners then proceeded to canvass the votes and after the canvass of said votes it was moved by Com. C.A.Larson and seconded by Com. J.B. Meeks that the following order be passed;

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF EMERY COUNTY, UTAH, RELATIVE TO THE FORMATION OF THE GREEN RIVER IRRIGATION DISTRICT.

And now at this time the Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to law and being in session for that purpose proceeded to canvass the votes cast at the election hold on the 19th day of April, A.D. 1910 between the hours of eight o' clock a.m. and 6.p.m. of said day, for the purpose of voting upon the question of the organization of the Green River Irrigation District, and for the various officers to be elected for said Irrigation district;

And it appearing from such canvass and the returns duly certified that out of a total of 1826.19 acres voted upon the question of the organization of said irrigation district "Irrigation District--Yes" received 1826.19 votes and that no votes were cast "irrigation district-- no".

And it further appearing from such canvass and the certified returns of said election, that a majority of the legal electors voting at said election, being a majority of the qualified electors entitled to vote at said election according to law cast votes at said election "Irrigation District -- Yes", or in favor of the organization of said irrigation district.

And it further appearing from the said canvass and the certified returns of said election that on the vote by acres a majority of the whole number of acres in said proposed district was voted at said election "Irrigation District-- Yes" or in favor of the organization of said irrigation district.

T.D.Spalding, 1 ballot, 10 votes by acres.

We therefore declare that E.H.Lyon, John H.Briscoe and E.B.Roberts received the highest number of votes cast for Directors of said Green River Irrigation District.

It is therefore ordered that E.H.Lyon, John H.Briscoe and E.B.Roberts be and they are hereby declared elected Directors of said Green River Irrigation District.

It is further ordered that a copy of this order and the plat of said irrigation District duly certified as required by law by the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners be immediately filed for record in the office of the County Clerk of Emery County, Utah pursuant to law, and the motion being put Co. WHEREAS, at an election duly called and held in Emery County, Utah, on the 8th day of January, 1910, after notice thereof had been duly given for the time and in the manner required by law, more than a majority of the votes cast upon the question were in favor of issuing the Bridge Bonds of Emery County, Utah, therefore:

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF EMERY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That under the authority of the election aforesaid, the Chairman and the County Clerk of Emery County, Utah, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to prepare and execute Bridge Bonds of said County to the amount of Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00) to be dated February 1st, 1910, and becoming due twenty⁽²⁰⁾ years after date, but redeemable at the option of Emery County at any time after ten years from date. Said bonds shall consist of thirty five (35) bonds of One Thousand Dollars, (\$1,000.00) each numbered from one (1) to thirty five (35) both inclusive, and said bonds shall bear interest evidenced by coupons at the rate of Five (5) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually

Section 2. The bonds hereby authorized shall be in substantially the following form;

Lawful Money of the United States of America on the first day of February, 1930, with interest thereon at the rate of five (5) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of February and of August in each year on presentation and surrender of the annexed interest coupons as they severally become due.

Both principal and interest of this bond are hereby made payable at the First National Bank of Chicago, Illinois,----- This bond is redeemable at the option of Emery County at any time after February 1, 1930.

This bond is one of a series of like tenor, issued for the purpose of constructing bridges in and for the County of Emery, in the State of Utah under the authority of Section 518 of the Revised Statutes of Utah, and an election duly called and held on the eighth day of January, 1910 and of an ordinance duly passed.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuing of this bond have been done, happened and been performed in regular and due form as required by law, and that the total indebtedness of Emery County, including this bond does not exceed the statutory or constitutional limitations.



Joint Board of County Commissioners of Grand and Emery Counties met at Green River, Utah on above date as per previous appointment. Present were all members of Grand County Board of County Commissioners. Commissioners Larsen and Singleton of Emery County Board and Mark Tuttle, Clerk Joint Board of County Commissioners and County Clerk of Emery County.

Chairman J.H.Johnsen called the meeting to order stating that the object of the meeting was to accept the bridge built Midland Bridge Co. at Green River, Utah and to transact any other business that may properly come before the meeting.

Mr.C.M.Oliver, Foreman Midland Bridge Co. on Construction work of said bridge then stated that the said bridge was in all respects completed and he asked that it be accepted and the bondsmen of the said Midland Bridge Co. released.

Robert Woodruff, Inspector for the Joint Board of County Commissioners then stated that he had carefully inspected the work of construction of said bridge then stated that in his opinion the work was of a high order and that the contract had been fully complied with. After a thorough discussion a motion to accept the said bridge and release the bondsmen of the said Midland Bridge Co. was made by Commissioner Larsen of Emery and seconded by Commissioner Branson of Grand and upon the motion being put the same carried unanimously. Not more than fifty head of cattle or horses or two hundred and fifty head of sheep allowed on this bridge at one time ".

A Communication from Fred W. Cahmbers, State Fish and Game Commissioner, relative to Emery County painting Trout fry in the streams of Emery county, was read and considered, and on proper motion the Clerk was instructed to notify the said fish and game Commissioner that it will be impossible for Emery County to handle the fry this year.

J. W. Johnson came before the Board in behalf of the Commercial Clubs of the County asking the Commissioners that they take the necessary steps to provide for maintaining an exhibit of the products of Emery County in the Vermont Building in Salt Lake City, The Board informed Mr. Johnson that they would favor the proposition of providing the case and floor space for the exhibit if the Clubs of the County would see that the exhibits were displayed without expense to the County.

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDANT OF DISTRICT SCHOOLS OF EMERY COUNTY, UTAH, IN RE-SUBDIVIDING SAID COUNTY INTO HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

Castle Dale, Utah, May 5th. 1911.

To the Hon. Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, Utah.

Gentlemen,--

I, Nephi L. Williams, the duly elected, qualified, sworn and acting County Superintendent of District Schools within and for the County of Emery, State of Utah, in conformity with the requirements of an act of the Legislature of the State of Utah, entitled "An Act Creating High School Districts and Providing the Manner of Sub-dividing the same and Etc." approved March Ninth 1911, do respectfully report, that, in my opinion, said Emery County should be sub-divided into two or more High School Districts and I therefore recommend the following plan of sub-dividing said county for said purpose,

1st.-That Green River School District No. 1, and Green River School District, No. 2, which School Districts now comprise Green River High School District, shall constitute a High School District and be known as Green River High School District of Emery County, State of Utah, and all of the lands now within the boundaries of said Green River School District No. 1. and said Green River School District No.2. no less nor no more shall be within said Green River High School District, namely:-

BOUNDARIES OF GREEN RIVER HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT, beginning at the intersection of the North boundary of Tp. 20 South, R 16 East, with Green River. Thence West to the NW Cor. of Tp. 20 South, Range 15 East, Thence South to S W Cor. of said Township and Range, thence East 2 1/2 miles. WHEREAS, one Nephi L. Thence South to South boundary of Emery County, thence ^{East} along said boundary to Green River. Thence Northwesterly along said River to place of beginning.

3rd:- That all the other School Districts of Emery County, State of Utah, as shown by the records of Emery County shall constitute a High School District and to be known as Castle Valley High School District of Emery County, State of Utah , and by such name shall constitute a body corporate and all the lands now within the said "Other School districts" of Emery County no more nor less shall be within Castle Valley High School District, namely:

The Commissioners of Emery County, Utah, met on this the above date all members present and the following business was then transacted.

MINUTES of July meeting was read approved and signed.

PETITION LAID OVER.

A petition from the people of Huntington precinct, asking that the State Road in Emery County that has been accepted by the State Road Commission and designated as such, be not changed from its present location, was read and on proper motion same was laid over.

A petition from the people of Desert Lake precinct asking that the Commissioners of Emery County, lend some assistance from the treasury of said county, to help them replace the dam at that place that was washed out by the waters in the month of June 1911, was read and considered and on proper motion same was laid over for the present.

COMMUNICATIONS.

A communication from David Mattson, member of the State Road Commission, stating that the said commission had apportioned \$2,000. and as much of the \$10,000. from the Bond issue as is necessary to be used South of Huntington is now available and that the County of Emery will be required to appropriate the sum of \$1,000. and make a levy of five mills on the following named precincts through which this State Road passes South of Huntington to and including the Town of Emery. Viz:- Huntington Precinct; Castle Dale Precinct; Clawson Precinct; Ferron Precinct; and Emery precinct. The above levy of five mills to be used in the above named precincts for the purpose of assisting in the construction or repair of the State Road in the above named precincts during the year of 1911.

The Commissioners having at their meeting in July appropriated the sum of \$1,000. for the above named purpose and made a levy of three mills on the dollar of the taxable property of the above named precincts and it appearing that the levy would have to be made five mills to meet the requirements of the State Road Commission. Commissioner James B. Crawford offered the follow-

INSTRUCTIONS, The Clerk was instructed to notify the State Road Commission that pursuant to instructions given Mr. Samuel Singleton, Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, they have started Heber Frandsen to work on the State Road south of the Town of Huntington, in Huntington Precinct with an outfit to do grading and also that this work was started pursuant to advice received in this office that there would be \$2,000.00 available from the State Road Building Fund and \$10,000.00 from the proceeds of the sale of of the Bond issue for this purpose, or as much as may be needed to carry on this work South from the Town of Huntington to and including the Town of Emery. for the year of 1911.

INSTRUCTIONS, The Clerk was instructed to notify Mr. David Mattson, Member of the State Road Commission, that pursuant to his instructions to Mr. Samuel Singleton, Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Emery County, they have instructed the County Surveyor to survey a road off of what is known as Poison Bench, North of the Town of Huntington on the State Road and to report to them his findings relative to the grade and the cost of constructing the same, and that upon receiving his report they would forward a copy of same to him.

INSTRUCTIONS TO COUNTY AUDITOR, IRRIGATION TAX, Advice being filed with the Commissioners, by the Secretary of the Green River Irrigation District that the levy of 85¢ on the assessed valuation of the Green River Irrigation District would provide more money than they would need and asking that the Board reduce the levy to 75 ¢ on the dollar and on motion of Com. Craw-

ford, seconded by Com. Peterson, duly put and carried, It was ordered that the County Auditor compute the taxes for the year 1911, on the assessed valuation of said district for irrigation purposes at 75 ¢ on the dollar instead of 85 ¢ on the dollar.

INSTRUCTED TO DRAW WARRANT FOR INSURANCE. On proper motion the Co. Auditor was instructed to draw warrant favor of O. Sorenson, Jr. for \$84.00 and to instruct the Treasurer to renew the insurance on the Court House and office furniture at the same figure that it has been heretofore insured.

PETITION. A petition signed by J. H. Killian and 129 other citizens and tax payers was read, said petition asking the Commissioners to assist in getting a road through what is known as Rock Canyon, \$661.00 in labor and money was subscribed to said petition by the signers, After considering the petition and hearing the arguments of some of the petitioners, On motion of Com. Peterson Sec. by Com. Crawford duly put and carried the Commissioners informed the petitioners that they would have the County Surveyor survey the road and his expenses would be paid by the County and the petitioners are to furnish men and team to assist the Surveyor in this work and the petitioners to stand that part of the expense. The Surveyor was instructed to survey, plat and file in the Recorders office a road commencing at the NE. Cor. of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, SEC. 23, Tp. 19 South, R 7 East, Salt Lake Meridian, and running thence in a North Westerly direction to and through what is known as Rock Canyon to the most feasible point on the West boundary of Emery County, Utah.

PETITION. The petition from the Officers of the Desert Lake Reservoir Irrigation Co. asking the Commissioners to assist them from the funds of the County in re-constructing their dam that was washed out by floods in June 1911, was again taken up, Com. Peterson made the following motion, to-wit:- That the Commissioners of Emery County assist the said Desert Lake Reservoir Irrigation Co. to the amount of \$100.00, Providing that the dam is so constructed that it can be used by the County as a public road, and provided that the said officers will grant to Emery County the right to use same as a public highway. said motion was Sec. by Com. Crawford, duly put to a vote and carried and was so declared by the Chairman.

Petition. A petition Signed by Geo. Fox and 248 other citizens and taxpayers of Emery County, was read, said petition asking that the Commissioners of Emery County, Utah, pay a certain note at the Emery County Bank for the amount of \$260.00 and interest for two months said note was signed by some of the cattlemen of Emery County and the money recieved from said note was used by the cattlemen of said county to hire legal assistance in the prosecution of one Robert W. Hill, said Hill was convicted of Grand Larceny in October 1910. As the conviction of this person has been a benefit to every one in Emery County the petitioners asked that this note be paid from the general funds of the County. After considering the petition and upon advice of the County Attorney, this petition was laid over for the present and until the Attorney could give information whether or not the Commissioners could pay this note and if paid by the Commissioners, whether or not it would be considered a just charge against Emery County.

ADDITIONAL RELIEF.

The Commissioners of Emery County, met in regular session on this the above date, All members present, and the following business was then transacted.

Minutes of the meeting of November 6th. 1911, read, approved and signed.

ERRONEOUS TAX. J. W. Seely, of Castle Dale, came before the Board and reported that his assessment Book "B", Page 18, Line 5, was erroneous for the reason that his sheep are all rented out to his boys and they had been taxed for the same and were paying tax on this same bunch of sheep. Upon advise of the Assessor that the facts stated by the said Seely were correct, the above assessment was declared erroneous.

ERRONEOUS TAX. The Co. Treasurer presented to the Commissioners a statement from C. A. Winters, of Castle Dale, said notice stated that the said Winters refused to pay the Town Tax on some personal property assessed to him Book "B" Page 5, Line 34, for the reason that said property is not and has not been for the past year inside of the Corporate limits of Castle Dale Town. After investigation it was found that the said report was correct and the said assessment was declared erroneous to the amount of \$2.06 the Castle Dale Town tax.

COMMUNICATION. From T. B. Beatty, Sect'y of the State Board of Health asking that the Commissioners appoint a Health Officer for Lawrence Precinct, to succeed Andrew Mortensen, deceased; and on motion of Commissioner Crawford seconded by Commissioners Petersen, William Arnold was appointed as Health Officer for Lawrence Precinct for the un-expired term of that office.

COMMUNICATION. From T. L. McCarty of Green River, Utah, asking that he be released from the bond of E. J. Cook, an abstractor, and also affidavits from said McCarty and J. M. French, stating their reasons for asking this favor. The said affidavits stated that one of the sureties on said bond, "David Cook" is now deceased, and that one of the other sureties, "Frank Cook" is not financially responsible, and that E. J. Cook the principal on said bond is not financially responsible; therefore they ask that they be released from said bond.

On motion of Louis W. Petersen, seconded by J. B. Crawford, duly put and carried, the Clerk is hereby instructed to notify the said E. J. Cook, to furnish another bond as abstractor, favor of Emery County, Utah, in the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars before the 1st. day of January, 1912, or his bond as abstractor would be canceled without further notice.

COMMUNICATION. From J. H. Calver, of Green River, Utah, addressed to the Clerk and asking that he be assessed with only the amount of land his deed calls for.

On proper motion the Clerk was instructed to notify the said Calver that in as much as his deed calls for all of a certain lot and said deed states that there are only

5.6 acres in said tract by actual survey the records here in the office show that there are 8.1 acres in the tract. Therefore the Commissioners are unable at the present time to do any thing in regard to this assessment.

COMMUNICATION. from C. A. Claspill, agent for the Dalton Adding Machine Co. was read, said communication asking if the Commissioners considered purchasing the adding machine that is in use in the offices in the Court House.

The matter of purchasing the machine was considered, and from all reports it appearing to the Commissioners that the said machine would be a great benefit to the officers and a saving in deputy work, and upon motion of Com. Peterson Sec. by Com. Crawford, the Clerk was instructed to notify the said Claspill to send the stand for said machine, also a bill for same and the Commissioners would instruct the Co. Auditor to draw Co. Warrant in payment for said machine at their next regular meeting, provided said machine is guaranteed for two years, and that the stand for same is sent to the County free of charge.

PETITION. from the residents and taxpayers of Huntington School District, signed by David H. Wood and 127 other citizens and taxpayers of said school district, was read, and said petitioners ask that the Commissioners establish a High School at Huntington, It appearing to the Commissioners that they could not comply with the request at this time as the provisions of the law relative to establishing High Schools had not been complied with said petition was not granted.

That on or about January 17th, 1907, an indictment was found by a United States Grand Jury against certain parties, it being claimed on the part of the government that the said certificates had been fraudulently acquired and that the legal titles to said lands were still in the United States, and that thereafter civil suits were commenced and are still pending to set aside the equitable titles claimed by the said petitioners.

WHEREAS, it appearing to the Commissioners that the facts set forth in the said petition and the arguments of the petitioners present at this time, that the prayers of the ~~prayers of the~~ petitioners are just and reasonable.

AND WHEREAS, it appearing to the said Commissioners that a compromise settlement of the taxes on the heretofore described lands would best subserve the interests of the County, State and any other taxing funds interested therein.

AND WHEREAS, it appearing to the Commissioners that there is some doubt as to the State's right to tax this property, hence there is some doubt as to the County's or any other taxing fund's right to tax this property.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, and it is so ordered that the County Treasurer of Emery County mark the above described property as listed on the 1911 assessment rolls as erroneous and to accept the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars heretofore mentioned as a compromise settlement of all taxes to date; and the County Treasurer is hereby further ordered to issue redemption certificates for the above described property in full, and also to apportion the One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars to the various taxing funds interested therein at the following rates to-wit:- State and State School 8 parts; County 5 parts; County School 3 parts; Interest County Bonds 6/10 part; County Bond Sinking Fund 7/10 part; Huntington School District 13 & 3/10 part and the County Poor Fund 3/10 part.

All the above and foregoing done in pursuance of the authority vested in us as a Board of County Commissioners by virtue of Section 2 of Chapter 115, page 191, Laws of Utah 1911.

ADJOURNMENT. On proper motion the Board adjourned until Dec. 5th. 1911, at 10 o'clock A. M.

The Commissioners of Emery County, met in regular session on this the above date, all members present and the following business was then transacted.

MINUTES of the regular meeting on the 4th. and 5th. of Dec. 1911, read, approved and signed.

REPORT. Samuel Singleton reported to the Board that the County Road between Ferron and Castle Dale was being flooded with water some was freezing and making it almost impossible to get over the road. On motion of Com. Crawford seconded by Com. Peterson the County Road Supervisor is hereby authorized to inspect said road and investigate the cause of the condition of said road and if he can secure evidence who the person or persons are that are causing this road to be flooded to have proceedings started at once to prosecute said person or persons.

REQUEST. Henry G. Mills of Desert Lake came before the Board and requested that the Commissioners appropriate \$100.00 or more to the Desert Lake Reservoir Company to assist them in rebuilding their dam that was washed out by the high waters last June, The Commissioners

informed Mr. Mills that at this time they could not make the appropriation ~~for~~ for the reason that if they made an appropriation for this work it would have to be on condition that the Board of Directors of the Desert Lake Reservoir Company grant to Emery County the right to the use of the dam as a public highway and unless the top of the dam was of sufficient width for a County Road they could not make the appropriation. Mr. Mills was further advised to have a contract drawn up stating that they would grant to Emery County the rightofway across said dam for a public highway for the amount of \$_____ and that said dam when completed would be of a stated width and then said Commissioners could decide whether or not the dam would be of sufficient width for a public highway. and if of sufficient width for said road and the contract properly executed they would make the appropriation of at least \$100.00.

COMMUNICATION from David Mattson, State Road Commissioner for this district, was read, said Mattson, stated that the State Road North from Huntington ~~is~~ as designated and mapped would be the State Road and that the same would not be changed as the people of Carbon County and Cleveland had asked and that work would be done on said road in the Spring of 1912 and that any thing the Commissioners could do preparatory to getting said work started in the Spring they were at liberty to do. Therefore it was moved by Com. Crawford and duly seconded by Com. Peterson, duly put to vote and carried, that Comm. Singleton purchase 20,000 feet of plank at least 5 inches thick and from 10 to 14 inches wide and 18 ft. long to be used on the State Road North from Castle Dale, and that Comm. Peterson purchase 10,000 ft. of plank to be used on State Road ~~is~~ South from Castle Dale to the Town of Emery, and of the thickness, width and length as stated above.

COMMUNICATION from Geo. Christensen, County Attorney of San Pete County, relative to one Myrren Hart, said communication stated that said Hart is an indigent person and that he had been sent from Emery County, Utah, into San Pete County by the people of Emery County, and asked that the Commissioners make arrangements for the return of said Hart to Emery County. On motion of Com. ~~Peterson~~ ^{Crawford} seconded by Louis W. Peterson, duly put to vote and carried, the Clerk is hereby instructed ~~to~~ to notify said Christensen that to the Commissioners knowledge said Hart left Emery County of his own free will and accord and that they would not make any effort to bring him back to Emery County, but if he wished to return to Emery County he could do so in the manner in which he left this county.

REPORT ACCEPTED. The report of the election of officers for the Green River Irrigation District was read, and on proper motion the same was accepted.

COMMUNICATION from the Sect'y of the Chamber of Commerce at Grand Junction, Colo., relative to a road west from the Colo. line through Emery County, The Clerk is hereby instructed on proper motion, to notify said Secretary that the matter of getting through Grand County would have to be taken up with the Commissioners of Grand County, and to notify said Secretary that the Commissioners are doing every thing in their power to get a road designate through Emery County from the City of Green River west to Castle Dale.

ABSTRACTOR'S BOND. E. J. Cook, Abstractor for Green River, filed an affidavit stating that he had made application for bond as they requested at their meeting on the 4th. of Dec. that said bond had not arrived and that he would not certify to any more abstracts until said bond was filed with the Commissioners ^{and} he was notified to that effect, and on proper motion the Clerk is hereby instructed to notify the said Cook that his license as abstractor is hereby revoked until said bond is filed and approved by the Commissioners.

REPORT ACCEPTED. the report of E. J. Grange as Justice of the Peace for Huntington Precinct was on advice from the Co. Attorney that the same was correct, accepted.

ORDER TO TAKE UP BONDS. On motion of James B. Crawford, seconded by Louis W. Pearson, member of the Town Board of Castle Dale Town, came before the Board and requested that the Commissioners grant them the privilege of meeting in some one of the offices or rooms of the Court House. COMMUNICATION. from Nathaniel Crawford, of Ferron, Utah, stating that his ditch along the County Road was destroyed when said road was constructed and it being a fact known to the Commissioners that said damage does exist, on proper motion the Clerk is instructed to draw Co. warrant for \$12.00 payment in full for said damage.

Appropriation. On proper motion the Co. Treas is hereby instructed to transfer \$200.00 from the General Fund of the County to the County Poor Fund. , also the transfer \$1000.00 from the General Fund of the County to the Salary Fund.

AID TO INDIGENT. On proper motion the Co Auditor is hereby instructed to draw Co. warrant on the Poor Fund of the County favor of Mrs. Blanche Jones for the amount of \$5.00 aid to indigent. Also draw Co. warrant on Poor Fund of County favor of Charles Pulsipher, for the amount of \$5.00 aid to indigent.

Report Accepted. G. Sorenson, Jr., Co. Treas. filed report that he has taken up the balance of the Bond issue of July 31st. 1897 amounting to \$4500.00 and interest to the 1st. day of Feb. 1912 amounting to \$45.00 , said report was on proper motion accepted.

Consolidation of School Districts. E. R. Adams of Green River, Utah came before the Board and filed a petition from the Citizens and taxpayers of Green River School District #2 , said petition was signed by J. H. Briscow and 21 other citizens of said district No.2 and the action of the petitioners of Green River School Dist # 2 was hartily endorsed by the Board of Trustees of Green River School District No.1 . Said petition requested the Commissioners to consolidate the Green River School District No 1 and the Green River School District No. 2, and the districts so consolidated to be known as Green River School District No. 1, and to comprise all the property now contained within the boundaries of Green River School District

No. 1 and Green River School District No. 2, After considering the petition and it appearing to the Commissioners that it would be to the best interest of the school districts heretofore named to be consolidated into one school district, and on motion of Comm. Crawford seconded by Comm. Peterson, duly put to a vote and carried all members voting "Aye" the petition was granted.

Grant for Public Highway. An instrument signed by the people of Desert Lake, representing a majority of the stock of the Desert Lake Reservoir and Irrigation Company, granting to Emery County, Utah the right to use the dam that is to be constructed at that place for a public highway, was read, and on proper motion same was not accepted for the reason that said instrument did not state the width the dam is to be on the top when completed and instrument should be signed by the Board of Directors of said irrigation Company.

Claim for Transitory Tax The claim of Wayne County for portion of tax for 1911 account of stock grazed in said county for portion of the year 1911, was read, said demand was for \$2.70 and account of S. C. Thompson, of Ferron, Utah. The claim was not allowed for the reason that there is no one in Emery County appearing on the tax rolls of this county by the name of S. C. Thompson.

PROTEST AGAINST PAYING SPECIAL SCHOOL TAX. A letter to the Treasurer of Emery County, from the Attorneys of Preston Nutter, protesting against paying any special school tax in this county for the reason that he should be placed on the transit stock list and not as a resident, was read. The County Assessor was present and informed the Board that the said Preston Nutter had requested that he be assessed in Emery County, Utah with 600 head of cattle as a permanent resident and not to place him on the transitory stock list and that reason he was assessed in this county as he the said Preston Nutter had requested and that he the said Preston Nutter was taking this stand at this time to get out of paying this tax, the assessor also presented to the Commissioners the tax statement as had been duly signed by the said Preston Nutter. The County Treasurer was instructed to make the attorneys acquainted with these facts and to inform them that Emery County ^{would hold} ~~will hold~~ this property for these special taxes.

REPORT. W. S. Peacock, Co. Road Commissioner, filed a report showing approximately the amount that had been expended in the respective road districts of Emery County, Utah, for the year 1911, said report was on proper motion accepted.

APPLICATION FOR LICENSE TO ABSTRACT. The application of B. D. Hatch of Green River, Utah for license as abstractor of Emery County, Utah, was read and on of Comm. Peterson seconded by Comm. Crawford, the Clerk is hereby instructed to notify the said B. D. Hatch that the Commissioners ^{will} ~~will~~ grant him a license as abstractor upon his filing with the Commissioners of Emery County, Utah, a satisfactory bond, favor of Emery County, Utah in the penal sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars.

Thereupon Comm. Peterson made motion that the Commissioners appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 as provided in said Sec. and Chapter of the 1909 Laws of Utah same to be used in conjunction with the \$2000.00 appropriated by the State of Utah, Upon the State Road of Emery County. said motion was duly seconded by Comm. Thereupon the Assessor assessed the said Nutter with 600 head of cattle as a permanent resident and as the stock were in the Desert Lake School District the assessment was placed in the Desert Lake School District, and he could not understand why the said Nutter was taking the stand he is at this time in regard to this assessment and if he refused to pay this Special School Tax he should be prosecuted for not filing his grazing certificate in 1911 as the law provides that he should.

The assessor advised ^{the Board} that to date the said Nutter has failed to file with him his grazing certificate for the year of 1912 and the County Attorney was instructed by the Commissioners to start a criminal action against the said Preston Nutter for not filing a grazing certificate for the year 1912 as the law provides.

The County Treasurer was instructed to proceed to collect the Special School Taxes against the said Preston Nutter for the year 1911/ according to law and upon advice of the County Attorney.

Browning being present, the matter was discussed and the said Ira Browning, was instructed to rent the county transit at the amount of \$1.00 per day, but he would have to be responsible to the county for the condition of the transit when returned, and that all rents from said instrument to be turned into the County Treasury.

BONDS APPROVED The bond of S. P. Snow, Deputy Co. Road Commissioner of Orangeville Precinct and the Bond of E. L. Allred, as Deputy County Road Commissioner for Ferron Precinct, was on proper motion accepted and approved.

INSTRUCTED On proper motion the Clerk is hereby instructed as follows, to-wit:-

To notify the J. I. Case Thrashing Machine Company of Salt Lake City, Utah, that they can ship to Emery County, On approval, One Road Drag "Steel" , 8 X 42, H & L, price \$36.00, and to inform them that Emery County would give the drag a fair trial and if found to be the kind of a drag that is needed for the County Roads, the Commissioners agrees to purchase the same, and is not satisfactory they are to have the privilege of returning the said drag to them.

To draw County Warrant for \$15.00 favor of Henry Thompson, in payment for one Flat Top Desk in said Sheriff's Office.

CHANGE IN COUNTY ROAD The County Road Commissioner is hereby instructed to allow the people to change the County Road from Molen to Clawson, providing that the people of the two precincts make said changes at their own expense and provide a good and sufficient right of way and grade the said road where any changes are made, and all without any expense to the County.

The County Road Commissioner is further instructed to allow Jess Fugate to make certain changes in the County Road through his place, provided that the said Fugate makes said changes at his own expense.

APPOINTMENT On recommendation of Henry Thompson, Sheriff of Emery County, Utah, W. H. Goldwire of Helper Utah, is hereby appointed as Deputy Sheriff for Emery County for the balance of the year 1912.

This being the time for the hearing of the petition of the Co. Supt. Of Schools, as to the matter of Sub-dividing the Castle Valley High School Dist. into Three High School Districts, and upon request of the Co. Supt. of Schools, Nephi L. Williams, this matter was laid over for one month, or until the next regular meeting of the Commissioners.

ERRONEOUS ASSESSMENT Leroy Miller came before the board and reported that his assessment, Book "B", Page 17, Line 27, for the amount of \$9.01 was erroneous, and proper showing having been made to the Commissioners that the same is erroneous, On proper motion the Treasurer is hereby instructed to mark said assessment as erroneous.

ALLOWANCE Heber Leonard of Huntington, Utah came before the board and reported that there had been a great deal of work done on the road from Mohrland to Black Hawk, and that one Jim Bradley had done most of the work and had done work to the amount of not less than \$50.00. Said Leonard requested that the Commissioners allow the said Jim Bradley the sum of \$25.00 for said services and he Heber Leonard would pay the balance for said work, this matter was referred to the County Road Commissioner and he reported that the work had been done and the amount asked for was reasonable, thereupon the County Auditor was instructed to draw County Warrant favor of the said Jim Bradley for the sum of \$25.00 from the General Fund of the County.

Communication A communication from E. F. Marshall, relative to the condition of the County Bridge across the SanRafel River, was read, As the Commissioners have already instructed the County Road Commissioner to inspect the condition of said bridge, no action was taken on said communication.

Communication A communication from David Mattson, relative to the work in Emery County, on State Road, being continued, was read and no action taken on same .

Communication A communication from one Nephi Williams to the State Road Commission and copy of their reply to his letter was read, said communication requested the said State Road Commission to reimburse the said Nephi Williams for damages he received while working on bridge on State Road near the Town of Emery, the said State Road Commission in their reply to Williams, stated that they could not pay any thing out of the State Road Fund for damages, but probly the County could pay him something.

The matter was considered by the Commissioners and it appearing that the damages was received while working on State Road and that damages if any were allowed, would be proper charge against the State Road Fund and not against the General Fund of Emery County, and under these conditions they could do nothing for him.
